So please join us on this important day – we have much to share and together, we must all Take a Stand for Child and Youth Mental Health!

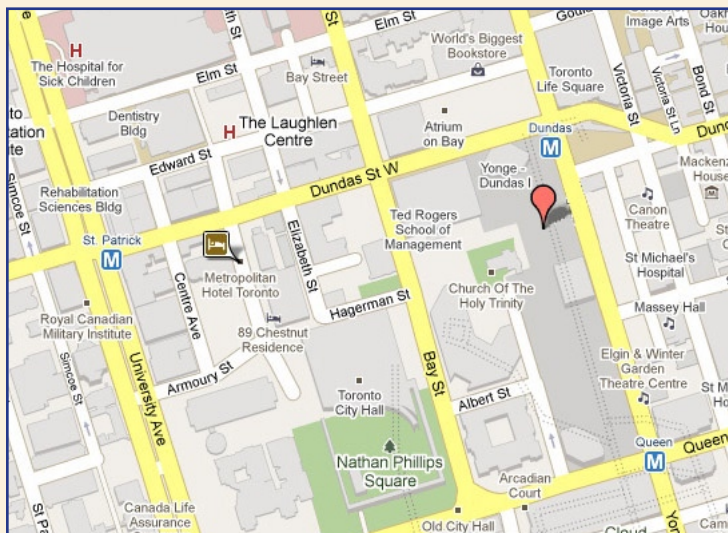

The desired outcome of this session is to ensure that all appropriate concerns and opportunities are addressed by the sub-committees that will lead this work throughout the winter, in preparation for further consultation with members in spring 2011.

Government Panel

Ontario's new policy framework for child and youth mental health is now being implemented, changes are happening in the child welfare system, and a Select Committee of the Legislature has proposed sweeping reforms for all government-funded mental health and addiction services. These and other provincial government initiatives will have major impact on child and youth mental health agencies and service providers. What does it all mean? How do they all fit together? How will it affect your agency?

This session will provide the latest updates from people at the centre of the latest policy and program developments at Queen's Park. Attendees will hear from the Assistant Deputy Minister who is leading the reform of children's mental health services within the Ministry of Children and Youth Services about progress to date and what lies ahead. The Chair of the Commission to Promote Sustainable Child Welfare will speak about how the intersection between child protection and children's mental health is expected to change. And we will hear about the impact of the Select Committee's proposals from a key player involved in that process. "System change" is moving fast and on many fronts – this session will keep you up-to-date on the action!
